


Funding source: Trust fund contributions

(in thousands of US dollars)




Funding source: Origins of trust fund contributions

UN regular programme of TC

- Expenditures of \$1.3 million in 2015 (+53%)
- ✓ To finance advisory services and training: such as training on key international economic issues (para 166 of the UNCTAD X Plan of Action)


Development Account

- √ 23 projects implemented with a total expenditure of \$2.8 million in 2015 (+43%)
- √ 10th tranche (2016-2019): \$2.9 million to finance 5
 projects of UNCTAD


TC expenditures by source of funds, 2011-2015

(in thousands of US dollars)




TC expenditures: Type of project

TC functioning: Requests from developing countries

□ Funding Gap (01/2013 - 12/2015):

About \$37.2 million to cover 39% of requests which were unfunded.

STIP Reviews; Virtual Institute; DMFAS; TrainForTrade; Assistance to the Palestinian people; P166 programme; Trade policy framework reviews; Services policy reviews; Accession to the WTO, etc.



TC functioning: Contribution to UN system-wide coherence

United Nations Inter-Agency Cluster on Trade and Productive Capacity: enhancing its role in the United Nations system-wide coherence.

☐ Highlights in 2015:

- √ Taking steps to establish a Multi-Donor Trust Fund to scale up activities of the Cluster;
- ✓UNCTAD & ILO join efforts to address the pressing needs of governments on priority themes (e.g. trade and employment) which require comprehensive solutions;
- ✓ Participated in the formulation of a new generation of UNDAFs mainly in Europe and Central Asia with UNDAF cycles starting in 2016.

Way forward: 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

- New initiatives in 2016/17
- To establish an organization-wide framework with minimum RBM standards for all TC programmes and projects.
- To establish new funding mechanism to better match the supply of funds to the demand for UNCTAD TC
- ✓ To further improve UNCTAD technical cooperation website
- ✓ To launch a UN Inter-Agency Cluster Multi-Donor Trust Fund on Trade and Productive Capacity
