

### **The Unseen Impact of Non-Tariff Measures**


Capacity building and negotiation support

- Support to negotiations of the African Continental Free Trade Area on non-tariff measures leads to successful signing of the agreement
- e.g. Cuban policy makers are trained in using the UNCTAD-TRAINS NTM database to identify market opportunities  $\rightarrow$  90% of participants say "very positive for my work"

Cutting edge research on NTM impact on developing countries and SMEs



- New estimations of ad-valorem equivalents (UNCTAD/World Bank study: The Unseen Impact of NTMs)  $\rightarrow$  finds that NTMs eclipse the impact of tariffs
- Regional workshops in Bangkok and Nairobi bring together 70 and 50 participants, respectively, from government, think tanks and private sector  $\rightarrow$  increased analytical capacity for evidence-based policy making



- over 100 countries, 90% of world trade covered
- → Database increases transparency → more competitiveness of SME exporters; more regulatory cooperation across countries; more domestic policy coherence between regulators; basis of UNCTAD's evidence-based support for negotiations and policy making

Leading global NTM data collection

- National data validation workshops in South-East Africa bring together government agencies for better policy coordination and coherence: 26 agencies in Zambia, 22 agencies in Kenya
- Training on NTM transparency in Thailand: 31 participants from all ASEAN member States → 90% of participants say that their understanding of NTM has improved "a lot" / "a great deal" in the evaluation questionnaire


