




The EU's free trade agreements are being used to about 60% by EU exporters






The degree of underutilisation varies among the EU's free trade agreements


#### The value of exports where the EU's free trade agreements are used (million euros)




## The value of exports where the EU's free trade agreements are not used (million euros)











The duty savings and duty costs of using and not using the EU's free trade agreements (million euros)





- Partner country imports are 8 billion euros cheaper
- EU's imports are 6 billion euros cheaper

- Partner country imports could be 12 billion euros cheaper
