 - trade flow statistics




- The Rules of Origin Self-Assessment tool in Access2Markets guides businesses throughout the rules of origin applicable to their product in a particular Trade Agreement.



How to document that the product is originating

To benefit from preference, originating products need to be accompanied by the appropriate proof of origin confirming their origin.

Please choose the case that applies to you

- If you are an exporter/producer located in the EU, you can self-declare
 that the product originates in the EU by making out a <u>statement on origin</u>.
 This statement can be made out:
 - by any EU exporter provided that the total value of the consignment is below €6 000
 - porter
 - by EU exporters that are registered in the <u>Registered Exporter</u> <u>System (REX)</u> for consignments of €6,000 and above.

 If you are an exporter/producer in Japan, you need to check the requirements for making out a <u>statement on origin</u> with your local customs authorities.

How to transport the originating products via third countries



 Originating products transported from the EU to Japan (and vice-versa) cannot be further processed in a third country.

However, some operations such as preserving products in good conditions, storage, splitting of consignments can be conducted in a third country if the products are kept under customs supervision. This is set out by the non-alteration rule.



The origin of your product

You have answered that your product HS 850760:

- · is wholly obtained;
- · fulfils the principle of territoriality;



Based on those answers, your product is originating in the EU.



Documentation on Origin

You need to document that your product is originating.

You have chosen to self-declare that your product is originating. Therefore you need to make out an origin declaration to indicate that your product is originating. Find details and practical information about how to make this self-declaration. Given that your consignment is 6000 Euro or above, you need to be an Approved Exporter according to the legislation of your country before you can make this declaration. As an exporter you are responsible for the correctness of the declaration and the information provided.



Transport conditions

You comply with the transport conditions for originating products. Therefore, the importer of your product can claim the preferential tariff.

A ROSA is a support tool offered by the European Commission and the result of your self-assessment is not a binding determination of the origin of your product.











Tool to compare rules of origin
