Background

2005: EU Commission proposes
simplification of the RoOs -
Self-certification

2010: reform of the EU GSP
rules of origin
Move to self-certification
(the REX system) in 2017

2024: REX used by the EU
and over 90 countries and
territories across the world



REX use

Since 2020, REX system is used in:

- the **EU GSP scheme + the Norway, Switzerland, Türkiye GSP schemes**
- **EU Overseas Countries and Territories**
- Progressively, application of the REX system by **EU exporters** in the context of **preferential agreements of the EU: Canada, Japan, Vietnam, Singapore, UK, Ghana, Côte d'Ivoire, ESA countries, New-Zealand.**

- Registration of exporters into REX

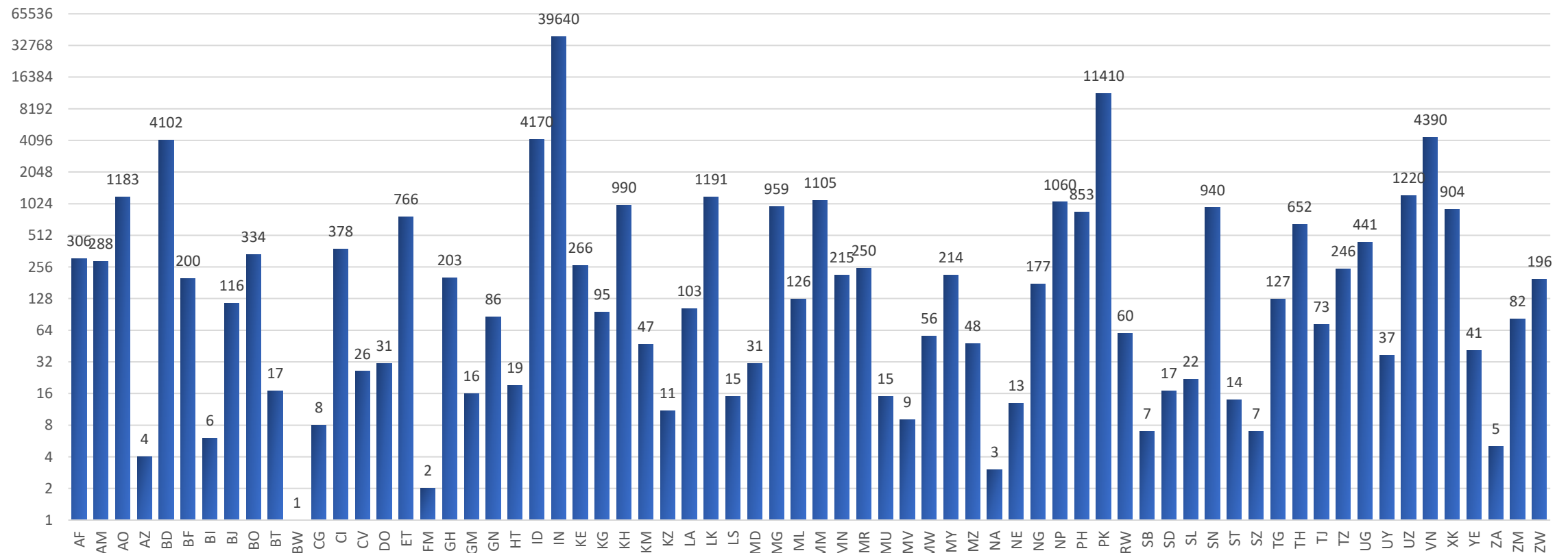

REX non-EU countries

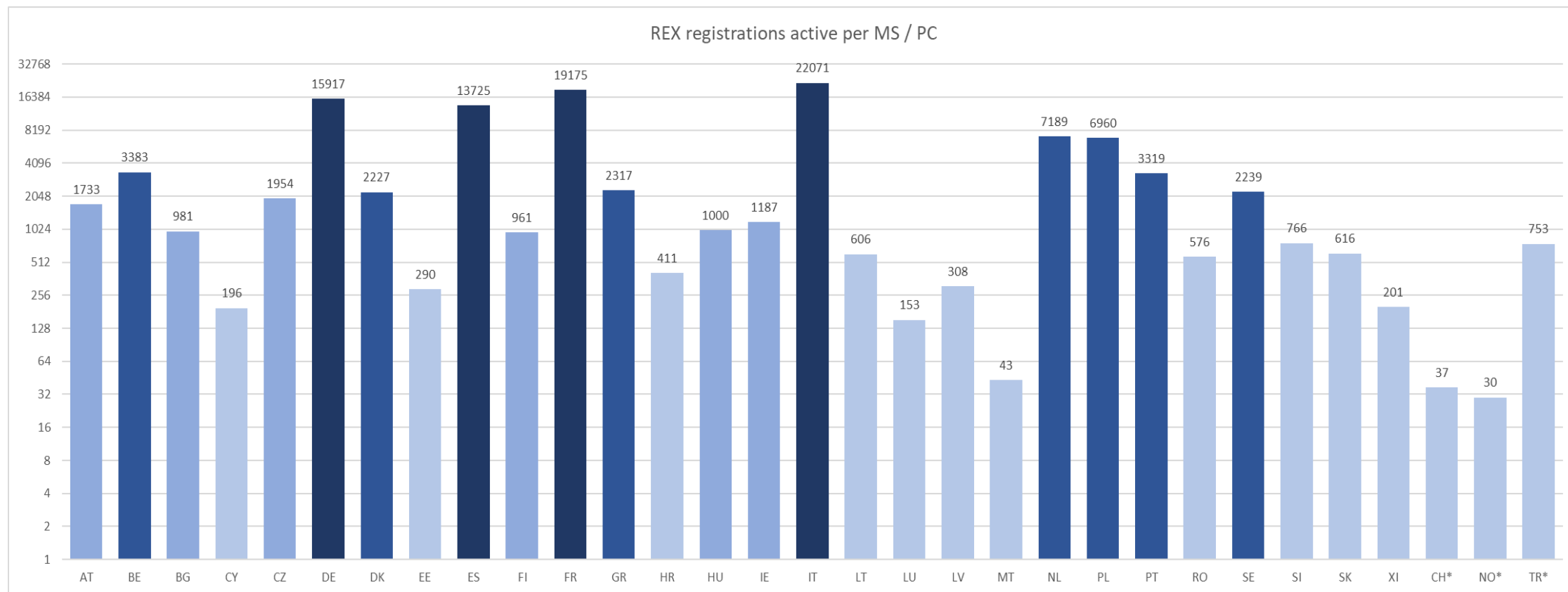
Over 81.500 registered exporters in non-EU countries
