1. Background

- ✓ In 2021, the municipal council of **Guacotecti**, Cabañas, requested proposals for the services of construction, maintenance, repair and design for road structures, through simplified procurement procedures.
- ✓ 6 competitors submitted bids in 5 public procurement processes:
- 1. J&M Group
- 2. COINVELC
- 3. WILCONS
- 4. D&A Constructors
- 5. WALTERVENEZ
- 6. Jorge Martínez

- ✓ Alert about suspicions of collusion among competitors
- ✓ Superintendency of Competition (SC) started its investigation
- ✓ Indicators of alleged cartel




Indicators of alleged cartel

A. Price breakdown of the economic offer

1. Identical average fixation of the percentage of indirect costs with respect to direct costs

Graphic 1. Percentage of indirect costs compared to direct costs




6 alleged cartelist divided into 2 groups:

- a) D & A, GRUPO J&M, Jorge Martínez, WILCONS 25%
- b) COINVELC, WALTERVENEZ 15%

2. Similarity and atypical closeness in the proportion of direct costs with respect to the unit price

Graphic 2. Proportion of direct costs to the unit price



5 alleged cartelist divided into 2 groups:

- a) D & A, GRUPO J&M, WILCONS proportion of 71%
- b) COINVELC, WALTERVENEZ proportion of 77%



Signals of the alleged cartel

- Important coincidences were found:
 - i) similarities in wording,
 - ii) similarities in spelling errors,
 - iii) similar formats;
 - v) coincidences in personnel.
- It became imperative to gather evidence concerning the communications and coordination among the suspected cartel members
- The SC decided to carry out 2 simultaneous dawn raids.



KEY POINTS:



- 1. Article 25 of the Competition Law: Agreements among competitors, such as price-fixing and bid-rigging, **constitute an administrative offense**, punishable by a maximum fine of 5,000 smmui (USD \$1.8 million). For particularly serious offences, the SC can impose the greater of:
- ★ Up to 6% of a company's total annual sales in El Salvador;
- ★ Up to 6% of a company's total assets in El Salvador;
- ★ Between two and ten times the estimated gain resulting from the unlawful practice.
- 2. Raids are conducted with prior judicial approval.
- 3. Cartel suspicions probably would not have been detected without the collaboration of Guacotecti's municipal council.

2. Experience with inter-agency cooperation

AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL:

Since 2023 an agreement allows collaboration with forensic experts of the Investigation Center of the National Police.





3. Results obtained in 2021 and conclusion of the bid rigging case.

As a result of effective interagency collaboration in both planning and execution, the Guacotecti case of 2021 allowed us to prove the existence of two cartel groups:

Group 1: Waltervenez and Coinvelc

Group 2: D&A constructors; J&M group and Wilcons








Envelope with Wilcon's bid




SANCTIONS IMPOSED

- 1. Coinvelc USD \$30,417.00
- 2. Waltervenez USD \$30,417.00
- 3. D&A Constructors USD \$38,021.25
- 4. J&M Group USD \$38,021.25
- 5. Wilson USD \$ 19,771.05

JORGE MARTÍNEZ: Based on the evidence gathered from the dawn raid, it was not possible to verify that Jorge Martínez had any communication or price coordination with the other economic agents under investigation.







- 1. Overcoming dawn raid challenges with limited resources.
- 2. Establishing effective collaboration between national and international institutions for technical support and training.
- 3. Gathering evidence to prove cartel involvement among competitors
- 4. Compelling evidence from raids resulted in five sanctions paid without appeal.



IN SUMMARY:

- 1. The effectiveness of inter-agency cooperation during dawn raids in combating bid rigging is essential for successful investigations and prosecutions.
- 2. By fostering a culture of collaboration and coordination among agencies, such cooperation can be optimized to effectively combat bid rigging, thereby enhancing the prominence and reputation of a competition authority among both the public and other governmental bodies.
