

Technical assistance activities 2022-2023

- 1. Regional and international activities:
- Closing activities of the UN Development Account project on "Global initiative towards post-COVID-19 resurgence of microenterprises and small and mediumsized enterprises".
- Continued work supporting the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA): protocol on Competition.
- Joint UN-ESCWA, UNCTAD and OECD Arab Competition Forum.
- UNCTAD SELA Working Group on Trade and Competition for Latin America and the Caribbean.



- Continued technical assistance and capacity building to Portuguese-speaking developing countries (African and Timor-Leste), funded by Portugal:
- Regional webinars to discuss best practices in competition and consumer protection policies and challenges in and perspectives on international cooperation in both fields (October 2022; April 2023);
- Assistance to the new Competition Authority of Cabo Verde in the implementation of its mandate;
- Assistance in the drafting of the Competition law of Timor-Leste.







Technical assistance activities 2022-2023

2. Co-organized activities:

- Morocco: training courses to raise awareness of competition law and policy among the media, and training course for judges in cooperation with the World Bank and the Morocco Competition Council.
- Nord Macedonia: training course for judges on the application of competition law in cooperation with the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development.
- Latin America: webinar on the implementation of *ex ante* measures and good practices for digital platforms in the region with the UN Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (UN-ECLAC).

3. National activities:

- Thailand: continued assistance on the contribution of competition policy to the resurgence of MSMEs.
- Malawi: dissemination of UNCTAD Voluntary Peer Review recommendations and capacity building workshop addressed to officers from the Competition Commission.
