The collaborative economy

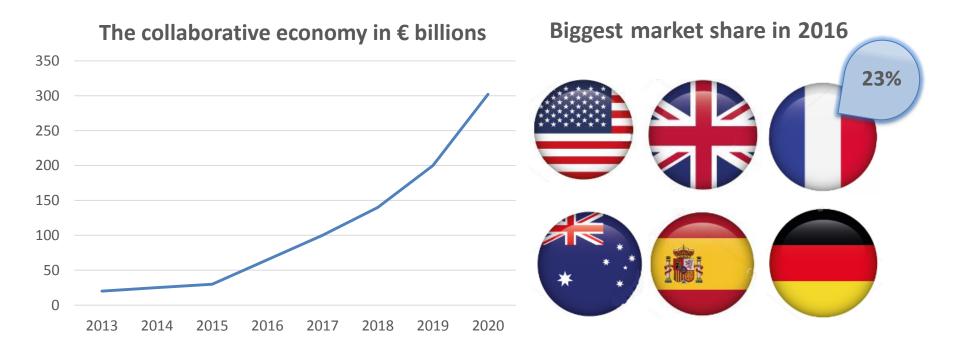
Context
