CONSUMER PROTECTION LAW AND POLICY











Purpose: to provide a forum for member States' representatives and relevant stakeholders to exchange experiences about mechanisms to detect, minimize, and tackle the risks for consumers health and safety due to defective products.

The WG discussed:

- a product safety mapping survey;
- the scope of consumer product safety, an instrument to prevent dumping;
- the high levels of informality in developing countries' markets;
- the fact that authorities are unable to take early measures due to the lack of information of accidents and injuries caused by defective products;
- the fact that e-commerce has been increasing and that and new mechanisms of control and risk assessment are required to tackle challenges and finally
- the need to make recalls more effective.
