What's the next agenda for the WTO?

- 1. Often framed in terms of 21st century issues—but what of the legacy items?
 - Plenty of reform still possible to "19th and 20th century" trade.
- 2. The "new" items: supply chains and services.
- 3. But does the focus on "what" miss the big picture?
 - Problem may be also "how" to secure agreement.
 - What is the basis of an acceptable binding deal?
 - Willingness to bind reforms appears limited.
 - The pendulum swings back to differentiation last seen in the Tokyo Round.
