Mandate of UNCTAD



UNCTAD fulfills its mandate by carrying out three main tasks:

- forum for intergovernmental discussions (meetings, exchange of experience, ...)
- research, economic analysis and information compilation activities
- **technical assistance adapted to the specific needs of the countries**

The mandate of the ASYCUDA Program:

- UNCTAD's main technical assistance program
- Mandate confirmed at the 14th UNCTAD Conference in Nairobi in July 2016, in "The role of UNCTAD" section, paragraph 38 (p) of the minutes ("*Nairobi Maafikiano*"):

"It (UNCTAD) should also continue to cooperate with Member States in implementing the Automated System for Customs Data (ASYCUDA). "

ASYCUDA Programme

- ASYCUDA Program (DTL / UNCTAD)
- Automated SYstem for CUstoms DAta (processing of full customs clearance procedure and integration of new functionalities related to trade facilitation)
- 30 years of experience in the modernization and simplification of customs procedures
- Around 90 user countries in 5 continents
- 6 regional centers
- 3 versions (v2.7, ASYCUDA ++, ASYCUDAWorld)
- 19 languages and 8 alphabets
- 18 experts in Geneva and 100 experts in the countries
- 70,000 trained users
- 15,000,000 customs operations per year

1 - Publication and availability of information

Access portal to ASYCUDAWorld: Standard portal ASYCUDAWorld can be modified easily. Some examples:

- ASYCUDA World Integrated Tariff
- Simulator of the calculation of taxes
- Direct integration of Electronic Manifest in XML format
- Follow-up of the status of the customs documents (Manifests, Declarations, ...)
- Notification of the arrival of means of transport
- Secure and Private Data Analysis Online (OLAP) and Publication of Public Statistics
- Electronic payment of taxes

Articles relating to the simplification of controls

ASYCUDAWorld allows :

5.1 - Notification for improvement of controls

- **send messages** (email, SMS) to users (operators, customs or other administrations)
- **entry of inspection acts from mobile phones, tablets, ...**



7.4 - Risk Management

- **automation of risk management:**
 - Random selection and selection parameters
 - Selection Criteria and Selection List
 - Assignment of declarations to sections and inspectors
- **multi-agency selection:**
 - To simplify and mutualize controls with other agencies (phytosanitary control for instance)
- **value control:**
 - Selection in a control lane if the minimum and maximum values are not respected
- **Post-control:**
 - Selection and display of general data and articles
 - Ability to display diagrams or export data in Excel or PDF format

ASYCUDAWorld allows

7.1 - Pre-arrival Processing

- **acceptance of anticipated manifests and declarations relating to ships and passengers** (in accordance with international regulations)




7.2 - Electronic Payment

- **electronic payment** via banks, via a one-stop shop or via the ASYCUDAWorld portal (setting up a secure WebService)

7.3 - Separation of Release from Final Determination of Customs Duties, Taxes, Fees and Charges


- **management of :**
 - deferred payment (credit)
 - guarantees (warehouses, temporary admission, transit)
 - security deposit for other transactions



Articles relating to clearance formalities

10 - Formalities connected with to importation, exportation and transit

- **ASYCUDAWorld allows :**
 - Electronic transmission (EDI) or direct entry (DTI) by operators of customs documents
 - The ability to attach scanned documents
 - Re-use of data (XML format)
 - The application of international standards
 - The electronic signature
 - User rights management
 - Historization of document versions...



11 - Freedom of transit

- **ASYCUDAWorld allows the management of transit :**
 - National, Regional and International
 - All modes of transport
 - Relationship between statements and documents of Transit T1
 - Automatic calculation of the guarantee
 - Integration of scanned documents
 - Interface with scanners
 - Control en route (office of passage)
 - Management of incidents, breakage, differences
 - Tracking deadlines

Agreement on Trade Facilitation (AFE) Article 10.4 - Single Window

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What is a Single Window ?

Single Window: Major Reform of Trade Facilitation

✓ Article 10.4 de l'Accord de sur la Facilitation des Echanges

- 4.1 - to **submit documentation and/or data requirements ... through a single entry point** After the examination by the participating authorities or agencies ..., **the results shall be notified to the applicants** through the single window ...
- 4.2 In cases where documentation and/or data requirements have already been received ..., **the same documentation and/or data requirements shall not be requested** except in urgent circumstances...
- 4.4 Members shall, **use information technology** to support the single window.

✓ Selon CEFACT/ONU (recommandation n°33)


- System allowing operators (trade / transport) to **communicate standardized information and documents to a single point of entry** in order to meet all the formalities required for import, export and transit.
- If the information is on **an electronic support**, the individual **data should only be submitted once**.



Single Windows - Objectives





- Facilitate the transmission of data and documents electronically for trade and transport operator (1 transmission only)
- Institute or increase cooperation between Customs and other government agencies to share electronic documentation (1 point of entry)
- Mutualize control procedures (1 common control only)
- 0 displacement / 0 paper documents (dematerialization)

WITNESSING SUCCESS

Rwanda
Rwanda (also accessible to other Customs Authorities and customs brokers within the East African Community)

- Reduced the time taken to clear goods from 34 hours in 2010 to 23 hours in 2014 – a 32% improvement.
- Reduced costs to importers from \$350 per declaration to \$243 – a 30% drop worth an estimated \$2 million annually.
- Generates net savings of some \$18 million per year.


Purpose of the System
Advancing Trade, Improving Economies

To advance trade through customs facilitation via a single, common electronic platform, allowing for submission of a single trade declaration that contains all information required by various trade controlling agencies in Rwanda.



E-SW in Rwanda - Description

- **Since 2012**
- **Objective:** facilitate international trade by speeding up and simplifying the flow of information between operators and government institutions.
- **Web page** connects customs, other government agencies and economics operators with ASYCUDAWorld

- **Jordania**
 - 7 Agencies (Ministries of Health, Commerce, etc.)
 - Multi-agency selection



- **Gibraltar**
 - Pre-arrival of boats, Port Authorities
 - Banks, Police, Fraud Control



- **Albania**
 - E-Taxes, Excise Management



- **Zimbabwe**
 - Banks, E-Taxes

- **Other projects in progress** : Ouganda, Kazakstan, Jamaica, Burundi, Comoros
