- Mission-Oriented Innovation: directing innovative activities
- Pro-poor and inclusive innovation: extending beneficiaries
- Grassroots innovation: broadening the innovation process to include grassroots actors
- Social innovation: from technological to social innovation















Multiple interacting objectives require an attention to:

- **D**irections of innovation, rather than its rate or scale
- Distribution of its costs, benefits and risks
- **D**iversity of innovation approaches





Policy Implications

This calls for policy mixes incorporating:

- Infrastructure and network facilitation;
- Financing and incentives; and
- Regulation to nurture innovation serving the SDGs and disrupt unsustainable incumbents
