- 2007: 1st ever break through export Singapore
- 2008 to 2013 average of 200 metric tons/year – 80% oversea "bulk" market
- 2014 to 2016 Low production of cocoa no overseas export market
- 2016 to 2017 No cocoa

- High Land transport costs
- Can not compete with the "BIGGERS"
- Association concept not easy to manage
- Poor processing facilities
- Low price viz other commodities
- Levies (many fees)
