Belize Forest Department oversees the sustainable management of Belize's forest resources.




Belize Fisheries Department has the direct mandate for the management of Belize's aquatic and fisheries resources.





**Fisheries Sector** 



Territorial waters: 18954 km2

Exclusive Economic Zone: 14755 km2

9 Fishing Zones established in territorial waters

9 Marine Reserves

Small-scale/artisanal fisheries

Employ approx 3,171 licensed fishers

872 licensed artisanal vessels

15,000 Belizeans direct beneficiaries





### Fisheries sector overview









- Fishermen are highly organized in fishing cooperatives.
- Fishing is done exclusively by free diving (use of SCUBA prohibited) and use of traps and handlines. Value of sector: US\$25 million
- Focused primarily on reef species: lobster, conch, finfish.
- Main export commodities include Caribbean Spiny Lobster and Queen Conch
  - Lobster export values representing 74.8%
  - Conch export values representing 24%
  - Other 1.2% include: King Crab, whole fish, aquarium fish, sharks

- Fisheries Act Chapter 210 (2000) amended in 2020, now Fisheries Resources Act No. 7 of 2020 (effective since February 14, 2020).
- Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) Bill 2022

### Non-Detriment Findings – Queen conch (Strombus gigas)

- 1. Currently an interim Scientific Authority is in place. A formal appointment of members will be made in accordance and once CITES Act is enacted
- 2. Full QC stock assessments done every 2 yrs since 2001. The objectives is to gather field data to determine population structure, mean shell length, density, abundance and biomass availability estimates, catch quotas established.
- 3. Queen conch exports require inspection of each shipment for compliance with fisheries regulations before a CITES certificate is issued by MA.
- 4. eNDF done for 2 hammerheads and silky shark in 2022.
- 5. Exports of shark meat requires inspection by Fisheries Department before a CITES certificate issued by MA.





### **Legal Acquisition Findings**

- 95% of fisherfolks and fishing vessels registered and licensed annually.
   Compliance is high.
- Fisherfolks licensed to fish in 2 Fishing Areas only. Compliance is high.
- Monitoring of 6 shark landing sites require additional resources to improve management.
- Enforcement of new New Regulations SI No. 128 of 2021 (Sharks).





### Introduction from the sea

- Belize-flagged vessels operating in the high seas are required to comply with national laws enacted under the High Seas Fishing Act 2013 and Statutory Instruments and National Plans of Action for Sharks
- One CITES certificate (shark) issued by MA to a registered HSF vessel (HSFU).
