





Total exports of marine fisheries (primary and processed is about \$200 billion in 2023, representing about 25% of all ocean goods exports)












Top 20 exporters of marine fisheries, aquaculture and hatchery species in 2023






Europe and Asia account for 40 and 30%, respectively, of imports of marine fisheries and aquaculture




Imports of marine fisheries, aquaculture and hatchery species grew by 28% between 2020 and 2023










Seafood Processing: Moving up the Value Chair


Developing economies accounted for 55% of the \$89 billion global seafood processing exports in 2023




