

A laser sensor scans 360 degrees around the vehicle for objects and helps determine its location. A processor reads the data from the sensors and regulates vehicle behavior.

Radar helps determine speed by detecting and measuring the speed of vehicles ahead.



Orientation sensor located inside the car tracks the car's motion and balance. Wheel hub sensor detects the number of rotations to help determine the car's location.



ore comprehensive solution on longer term e.g. comprehensive Global Value hains [GVC] treaty at WTO

ork on definition: suggested preliminary definition for Mode 5 services
