

1. Secretary General's Executive Committee -adopted a decision in Jan '18:

 "DSG's office to convene UN entities to develop, in collaboration with the World Bank Group, a common approach to the broader issue of registration and legal identity, taking into account the importance of preventing statelessness, in support of the Sustainable Development Goals and the overall vision of leaving no one behind."

2. Next Deliverable: Comprehensive and Inclusive definition on *"legal identity"*

23 organizations have endorsed 10 common goals for ID systems



Inclusiveness: Universal Coverage and Accessibility

Design: Robust, Secure, Responsive, and Sustainable

- **1. Universal coverage** for individuals from birth till death, free from discrimination
- 2. Barrier free access, including information, technology disparities, or direct and indirect costs
- 3. Establishes a **robust** unique, secure, and accurate identity from **birth till death**
- Platform is responsive to the needs of users and interoperable
 Collects and uses data proportionally and with minimal disclosure
 Uses open standards and is vendor and technology neutral
 Financially and operationally sustainable without compromises on access
- **Governance:** Trust, Privacy, and User Rights
- 8. Comprehensive legal and **regulatory framework** which safeguards user rights and data privacy & security
 - Established and clear institutional mandates and accountability
- 10. Enforced legal and **trust frameworks** through independent oversight and adjudication of grievances

Towards a global tool to analyze legal and regulatory systems: The ID Enabling Environment Assessment (IDEEA)

IDEEA assesses both the legal **enabling** environment

- Digital, Foundational, Unique, Random, and Universal ID
- Set institutional mandates and responsibilities
- ✓ Interoperability with CRVS and other government databases
- ✓ Mutual Recognition
- ✓ Technology Neutrality

..as well as a series of **safeguards** to ensure...

 Nondiscrimination & inclusion
 Personal data protection
 Security of physical elements & data against risk of compromise, destruction, or unauthorized use

1=

- Data obtained & disclosed with user consent
- Data obtained and used specified purpose
- Users rights to obtain and correct data
- User redress & remedies
