WSIS related decisions

WSIS and SDGs

67. We call for the continuation of annual reports on the implementation of outcomes of the WSIS, through the CSTD, to the ECOSOC, taking into account the follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and in this regard invite the high-level political forum on sustainable development to consider the annual reports of the CSTD. We encourage the members of the UNGIS to contribute to the reports



 Request the Chair of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development, through the Economic and Social Council, to establish a working group to develop recommendations on how to further implement enhanced cooperation as envisioned in the Tunis Agenda, taking into consideration the work that has been done on this matter thus far.



 65. We note, however, the divergent views held by Member States with respect to the process towards implementation of enhanced cooperation as envisioned in the Tunis Agenda. We call for continued dialogue and work on the implementation of enhanced cooperation.



 The group, which shall be constituted no later than July 2016, will decide at the outset on its methods of work, including modalities, and will ensure the full involvement of all relevant stakeholders, taking into account all their diverse views and expertise.



Structure of the WGEC

- 4 4 government representatives of member states of the 5 regions of the CSTD + Switzerland and Tunisia (22 members)
- 5 5 representatives of other stakeholders (civil society, academia/technical community, business, international organizations) (20 members)



Selection of members of the WGEC

- 1. Expertise, gender and geographical balance
- 2. Process
- CSTD regions vice-chairs/focal points start consultation with members
- Other stakeholders (civil society, academia/technical community, business) focal points start consultation with respective stakeholder community
- International Organizations
- 3. Deadline nomination by 31 March 2016



Constitution of WGEC

- 1. CTSD regions, stakeholder groups submit nominees to CSTD Secretariat by 31 March 2016
- 2. Chair submits list to 19th Session of the CSTD from 9 -13 May 2016, Geneva
- 3. The ECOSOC draft resolution on WSIS follow-up takes note of the constitution of the WGEC (list of members annexed to the resolution)
- 4. In July 2016 ECOSOC considers the draft resolution and budgetary implications
