Your Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is a great pleasure to be here with you today. I would like to thank for this invitation and extend my greetings to our UNCTAD colleagues with whom we have collaborated on this study.

Talking Points

- This study, developed in collaboration with MESCTI goes beyond sectorial boundaries, providing **important recommendations to support innovation from a cross-cutting, systemic perspective.**
- One of the interesting elements of this work is the way in which it connects innovation with the Diversification of the Economy, which is to some extent a result of interagency collaboration.
- The intersectorial nature of innovation therefore implies that it is critical to improve coordination and establish integrated policies. UNDP has been supporting the Government of Angola in strengthening capacity and coordination, to achieve a more systemic approach to development.
- Angola is a country that is taking significant steps to transition from an economy centered around oil production and heavy dependence on imports, towards a diversified economy that can harness the great potential found in agriculture and industry to create new products and services, generate jobs, and build a more sustainable future. UNDP Angola has been supporting the Government of Angola,



- in the diversification of the economy, through the growth of the productive sectors (agriculture and industry).
- We have been working with Ministries, at central and local levels, strengthening technical, professional, and vocational training, and implementing specific initiatives to increase employment and entrepreneurship.
- This study highlights the role of private sector in innovation and economic diversification. We believe that strategical support to the private sector is critical. More programs targeting MSMEs, cooperatives and associations within strategic value-chains are needed.
- **Digitalization and access to internet are critical factors for innovation and development**, playing a fundamental role in access to health, education, and markets, with significative impacts in livelihoods and the economy. The **expansion of connectivity must be inclusive** to ensure the same opportunities for all Angolans, leaving no one behind. UNDP has a global commitment to digital inclusion through its strategic plan.
- Our new CPD, aligned with the new NDP 2023-2027, we will reinforce our commitment to support the GOA through work on health, employment, and climate change as key priority areas, with a special focus on women and girls, and ensuring that innovation is cross-cutting, acting as a fundamental enabler for sustainable development.
