The Eurasian Economic Commission participates in UNCTAD projects on competition, including the activities of working groups and the development of documents.

UNCTAD conducted Legal assessment of the Eurasian Economic Union competition rules and regulations. We use the recommendations provided as a result of this work for further improving the competition law of the Union.

As you know, the EEC initiated a dialog of regional organisations on competition.

We highly appreciate the support provided by UNCTAD to this initiative. With the technical assistance of UNCTAD, we held 5 meetings that became a useful and effective mechanism for professional exchange between regional organisations on competition.

Furthermore, at the initiative of the Eurasian Economic Commission, the topic «Competition and regional economic organisations» for the fourth time has been included in the agenda of UNCTAD's main competition-related events: the IGE and the 9th UN Conference on Competition.
