## **Defining Culture**

A set of institutions that determine individual and/or group behaviour and attitudes in the sphere of market competition. These are influenced by wider social institutions and public policy choices and include customs impacting the degree of business competition and cooperation within a jurisdiction.

## Defining Culture...differently - Zooming out

'legal culture is the network of values and attitudes relating to the law, which determines when and where people turn to the law, or government, or turn away'

Legal culture is the bind between the structure of the legal system and its substance

#### We need to ask ourselves:

- Why was the law introduced?
- What does it try to achieve?
- How is it applied?
- How is it perceived?





## Defining Culture...differently – Zooming out

#### **External legal culture**

The values and attitudes in society that determine which rules work, which do not work and why

Opinions, interests, ideas and pressures brought to bear on the law by wider social groups



#### Internal legal culture

The values and attitudes of members of society who perform specialised legal tasks



David Nelken's work questions the clear boundaries of Friedman's idea of legal culture


Legal culture is more personal and less bound Family lawyer vs copyright lawyer
