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I . KFTC's history of combating cross-border cartels

- o Graphite electrode international cartel (2002)
 - KFTC's 1st international cartel enforcement against six graphite electrode manufacturers
- "Monopoly Regulation & Fair Trade Act" was amended to allow for extraterritorial application (2004)
- KFTC established International Cartel Division (2008)
- Air cargo carriers' international cartel (2010)
 - KFTC simultaneously conducted dawn-raids and shared information with foreign competition authorities to investigate an international cartel involving 21 Air Cargo Carriers

I . KFTC's history of combating cross-border cartels

- KFTC imposed strict sanctions in order to deal with cross-border cartels
 - Administrative sanctions (corrective measures, administrative fines, etc.)
 - Criminal sanctions (referral to the prosecution)
- o Through these efforts, KFTC has become one of the world's major competition authorities in enforcing cross-border cartels.

II. Ways of addressing enforcement challenges based on KFTC's experience

- o Challenges of applying domestic competition law to international cartels involving overseas companies
- o Contributions of competition authorities
- 1) International cooperation
 - Efficient international cartel enforcement entails: information sharing, coordinated investigations, discussion to avoid double sanctions, etc.
- 2) Capacity-building for cross-border cartel detection
 - Effective operation of the leniency program
 - Regular monitoring of potential cartels

III. Conclusion

- o International cooperation is the key to successful enforcement against cross-border cartels
- o KFTC is willing to share our valuable experience and know-how with emerging competition authorities
