




### Messages, alerts and policy considerations



## Key message 1: Leveraging services achieves SDGs

- Services substantially contribute direct/indirectly (inputs to all sectors) to reduce vulnerability & enhance economic diversification
- As a result, services development support SDGs. E.g. Goals 1,2,5–9,11
   & 17 on increasing exports from developing countries/LDCs.



#### Key message 2: Benefits are not automatic

It is necessary to enable services as an enabler of development:

- Sound regulatory/institutional frameworks to create capacity on services & on the role of their inputs.
- Smart regulations to minimize trade impact & ensure policy goals.
- Coherent/coordinated approach to domestic policymaking, regulation & trade liberalization.








#### Key alert 1: COVID-19 "new normal"


- Reinforced the potential of services for **resilience**, shock **recovery** & progress in **SDGs**.
- Calls for the pro-development services sector.



# Policy considerations 1/2: Balanced growth strategy

#### UNCTAD

#### Under the COVID-19 "new normal":

- Consider potential of services inputs to **transform economy/trade** & improve productivity & export competitiveness.
- Servicification can be key for modern farming and industrialization.
- Outcome of this option depends on coherent/best-fit mix of trade/industrial policies to promote **key services inputs**.



#### Policy considerations 2/2: Mind the gap

- Mind the structural gap between developing & developed countries.
- Consider mix of trade/industrial policies to upgrade within services.
- Outcome of this option depends on: **policy mix**, **international coop**., **preferential treatment**, adjustment costs, first mover advantages.
