International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF)


SINCE 1896

- over 18 million transport workers
- including 1 million seafarers

ITF coordinates a unique worldwide network of inspectors



THE IMPACT

- At its peak, 400,000 seafarers stuck on ships
- No access to emergency medial care
- Mental health impact
- Abandonments
- Threat to livelihoods through loss of income
- Economic impact on labour-supply countries




FINDING PRACTICAL SOLUTIONS

- Human rights due diligence tool
- Vaccination guidance



KEY WORKER STATUS

- Multiple global calls on governments
- 64 countries recognised seafarers so far
- Additional rights vary between countries
- Focus: priority access to vaccines



MARITIME LABOUR CONVENTION

- Foundation of the maritime industry
- Minimum human and labour rights
- MLC applies at all times, ensuring
 - decent working and living conditions
 - safe and secure workplaces
 - repatriation
 - shore leave
 - medical assistance
