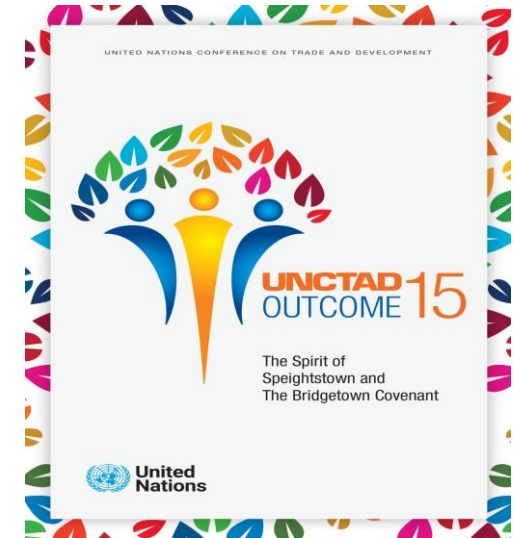

Economic & Social Impact (2023/24)



Afghanistan

- ▶ 50,000+ trucks delivered humanitarian aid during 2023



Antigua and Barbuda

- ▶ Customs revenue increased 21% from Jan-Jun 23 to Jan-Jun 24



Gambia

- ▶ 23% increase in customs revenue from 2022 to 2023



Iraq

- ▶ 215% increase in customs revenue at Baghdad International Airport from Jan-Jun 23 to Jan-Jun 24



Moldova

- ▶ Exports validated in 15 minutes using ASYCUDA New Computerized Transit System



Palau

- ▶ 53% increase in customs revenue during Q1 2024 compared with Q1 2023



Timor-Leste

- ▶ 86% reduction in processing time for animal and plant permits in 2023



Vanuatu

- ▶ 400% increase in revenue collection since the implementation of Single Window in 2016



Zimbabwe

- ▶ 379% increase in fees collected by Port Health Authority since Single Window launch in 2023

eTrade Readiness Assessments and E-commerce Strategies

eTrade Readiness Assessments (eT Readies)

- Conducted in 34 countries and **2** regional economic communities
- 2023/24: **Peru, Ghana, Mauritania**
- In progress: **Algeria, Timor-Leste, Trinidad & Tobago, Zimbabwe and Indonesia**
- Seventh session of the IGE on E-Commerce and the Digital Economy “**Building digital readiness: From assessments to implementation**”, 6-8 May
- Launch of the **eTrade Reform Tracker** in 2024 (Kenya, Mauritania and Solomon Islands)

E-Commerce Strategies

- 13 completed, including one regional strategy
- Ongoing: **Timor-Leste, Trinidad & Tobago and Ghana**

Empowering Women Digital Entrepreneurs

Advocacy and women leadership

- In May 2024, eTrade for Women appointed 6 new Advocates
- Presence across Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, South-East Asia & the Arab region, **expanded into South-Asia**

The eT4Women Communities

- Network now includes 365 women-led businesses in 40 countries, 15 leaders
- New research with ESCP Europe and GIBS focuses on challenges faced by women digital entrepreneurs, particularly in Africa

Capacity building:

- 2 new **Masterclasses**: for French-speaking Africa (April 2024, Senegal) and South-Asia (December 2024, India)
- 35 entrepreneurs will benefit from an Entrepreneurship Workshop and **study tour in China** in November 2024
- eTrade for Women Academy: A digital platform with curated materials, actively used by 150 members



Capacity-Building on Measuring the Digital Economy

222 in-person workshop participants from 62 countries in Africa and Asia

- Two workshops on Measuring the digital economy (with IMF, UNSD, OECD)
- Three workshops on “Services and Digital Trade statistics” (with IMF)
- Workshop on measuring digital trade in Arab countries (with IMF, OECD, WTO, UNESCWA, Arab Monetary Fund)
- Regional Workshop on Measuring E-commerce in Central Asia (with World Bank)

>350 webinar participants

- Webinar on measuring digital trade; 40 countries (with UN SIAP)
- *Asia Pacific Trade and Investment Report* online course, live session (with UNESCAP)

Task Group on Measuring e-commerce value (TG-eCOM)

- Participants from 23 member states + partner IOs working together to *develop internationally agreed guidelines and recommendations on measuring e-commerce value and digitally ordered trade*
- → basis for capacity building



Science, Technology and Innovation

- STI Policy reviews: **Angola** finalized; **Botswana** and **Seychelles** near completion
- Botswana STI Foresight report finalized
- Technology Assessment project in Africa
- STI park development project
- STI capacity building through the UN Inter-agency task team (IATT) under the Technology Facilitation Mechanism



Cooperation through CSTD

- CropWatch Cooperation Programme to **build resilient agriculture** (China)
- **Young Female Scientist Programme** and Young PhD Programme in Japan, Okayama University (first PhD graduate, Sep. 2024)
- STI Capacity Building Programme for **Female Researchers from developing countries** (Thailand)
- **Harnessing satellite technologies** in sustainable urban development programme (Portugal)



Courses on Key Issues on the International Economic Agenda (P166 programme)

Regional courses:

- Eastern Europe/Central Asia (North Macedonia)
- Middle East and North Africa (Egypt)
- Africa (Kenya)
- Asia and the Pacific (Pakistan, upcoming)
- Latin America and the Caribbean (Argentina, upcoming 2025)
- **69 policymakers** from **41 countries** trained between 2023 and now

11 short courses: for Geneva-based delegates in 2023-24

- Over **250 delegates** trained so far, from 100 **Geneva Missions**



Challenges & Strengths

- **Increased demand** on the work of subprogramme in 2023 – **161 formal TC requests calling for DTL** expertise
- Of which **66** formal TC requests **remain unfunded**
- Need for **long-term** trust fund approaches to **funding**
- **Highly skilled workforce** and **strong expertise** underpin **technical capacities**
