



## Addressing Non-Tariff Measures to strengthen Regional Integration and Sustainable Growth

With the general reduction of tariffs, the ability to gain market access depends increasingly on compliance with trade regulatory measures. Many non-tariff measures (NTMs), such as TBT and SPS measures protecting health and the environment, are directly linked to the Sustainable Development Goals. But NTMs increase costs for exporters and consumers. Balancing the different effects of NTMs is a core challenge for trade policy makers.

The number and scope of NTMs is increasing. The plurality creates a complex system increasing trade costs. Often, Regional Trade Agreements attempt to address the resulting challenges through harmonization or mutual recognition to deepen their regional economic integration. The multilateral trading system plays an important role to ensure regulatory convergence at the global level. Discussions will address

- NTMs as building blocks for regional integration: defining venues for NTM coherence and harmonization in RTAs
- NTMs as sustainability policies: maximizing their effectiveness for the attainment of the SDGs
- The important role of the multilateral trading system for regulatory convergence
