Item 1: Election of officers

1. It is recommended that the Expert Meeting elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson-cum-Rapporteur.

Item 3: Problems of and potential for the application of current trade facilitation measures

- 3. The Commission on Enterprise, Business Facilitation and Development decided to convene an Intergovernmental Expert Group Meeting on Efficient Transport and Trade Facilitation to Improve Participation by Developing Countries in International Trade: Problems and Potential for the Application of Current Trade Facilitation Measures.
- 4. As agreed by the Commission, this Expert Meeting, on the basis of the commitment stated in paragraph 27 of the Doha Ministerial Declaration, will discuss current trade facilitation measures, their application in developing countries and the importance and means of further reducing the divide between more and less advanced countries and regions in the formulation and application of global trade facilitation instruments.
- 5. The Meeting will address the impact of trade facilitation measures on the international trade of developing countries and their effect on effective capacity-building. In particular, it will consider (i) implementation issues, including (a) the use of information technologies in Customs and transport management systems as well as the potential consequences for trade of recent security initiatives; (b) the required environment for trade facilitation, including logistics, transport services and infrastructure as well as the legal famework; and (ii) the development dimension issue, including (a) the role of regional and local partnerships in formulating trade facilitation needs and priorities; and (b) the stakes and alternative positions regarding potential adoption of multilateral binding rules on trade facilitation.

6. To facilitate the discussions, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared an issues note on problems and potential for the application of current trade facilitation measures (TD/B/COM.3/EM.17/2). In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject under discussion. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received.
