Item 3: Promoting the export competitiveness of SMEs

- 3. The eighth session of the Commission on Enterprise, Business Facilitation and Development, held in Geneva from 12 to 15 January 2004, decided to convene an Expert Meeting on Promoting the Export Competitiveness of SMEs.
- 4. As was agreed by the Commission, this Expert Meeting will examine how the regulatory framework could be strengthened, including through the encouragement of SMEs' links to international supply chains, the promotion of backward and forward linkages of foreign affiliates, and the encouragement of corporate social responsibility.
- 5. The aim is to identify policies and measures to be recommended to governments, the private sector and the international community that could help strengthen the export competitiveness of SMEs in developing countries.
- 6. To facilitate the discussions, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared an issues note "Promoting the Export Competitiveness of SMEs". In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject under discussion. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received. Panels will be organized to bring together three to four experts on each issue to launch the discussion.
