FREE MARKET COMMODITY PRICE INDEX APRIL 2018

Average free market commodity prices, as measured by the Free Market Commodity Price Index (FMCPI), were 20.6 percent higher in April 2018 compared with April 2017. The index increased by 6.3 percent between March and April.


In April 2018, prices on average increased by 20.6% year-on-year




The FMCPI excluding fuels increased by 3.4 percent in the year to April 2018 but fell by 0.1 percent between February and March 2018.

Figure 1. FMCPI year-on-year percentage changes (Percentage)










Contributions to annual change

The main drivers to the year-on-year changes were fuels (+32.1%) and minerals, ores and metals (+5.8%). Prices for food (+0.5) and agricultural raw materials (-1.2%) remained almost constant (see Figure 3).

Contributions to monthly change

The main driver to month-on-month changes were rising fuel prices (+10.0%). Prices for food (+0.0%), minerals, ores and metals (-0.2%) and agricultural raw materials (-0.6%) remained almost constant (see Figure 3).

New series

The Free Market Commodity Price Index has been updated and rebased to Year 2015 = 100. The composition of the basket has been updated as have the product weights. For more information on the details of this update, see methodological note (UNCTAD/STAT/CPB/MN/1). The previous series (2000 = 100) spanning the period January 1960 to December 2017, has been discontinued, but is available on UNCTADstat.

UNCTAD's Free-Market Commodity Price Index displays the average development of prices of main primary commodities exported by developing economies. The figures above are based on a new version of that index, obtained as result of a re-basement and partial re-conceptualization of the previous index.
