<u>Item 2</u> - <u>High-level-Segment: How can the post-Doha process work best for development</u>

The High-level interactive debate was video-linked with a group of Permanent Representatives in New York.

Mr. Rubens Ricupero, Secretary-General of UNCTAD, opened the debate of the High-level Segment.

The keynote speaker, Dr. Supachai Panitchpakdi, Director-General of the World Trade Organization, addressed the High-level Segment.

In the interactive debate, from New York the representatives of Pakistan, Morocco, Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, European Commission, Venezuela, Egypt and Saint Lucia made comments and asked questions during the meeting.

From Geneva, the representatives of European Union, the European Commission, India, Austria, China, Nepal, Zimbabwe, Honduras and the Russian Federation contributed to the interactive debate.

Dr. Supachai Panitchpakdi responded to the questions put by delegations.
