Thursday, 10 October 2002

933rd and 934th plenary meeting

- <u>Item 6</u> <u>Review of developments and issues in the post-Doha work programme of particular concern to developing countries</u>
 - Mr. Rubens Ricupero, Secretary-General of UNCTAD made an opening statement.
 - Mr. Carlos Fortin, Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD, introduced the item.
 - Mr. Kipkorir Rana, Deputy Director-General of WTO, also made a statement.

The following representatives made statements: Egypt (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China); Denmark (on behalf of the European Union), followed by the European Commission; Indonesia (on behalf of the Asian Group and China); Barbados (on behalf of the Latin American and Caribbean Group); Morocco (on behalf of the African Group); Japan; Islamic Republic of Iran; Bangladesh; Thailand; Belarus; and Venezuela.

At its 934th plenary meeting, the Board continued the general debate under agenda item 6. Statements were made by the following representatives: Nicaragua, Norway, Cuba, China, United States of America, India, and Jordan.

The representative of the International Conference of Free Trade Unions (ICFTU) made a statement.

The Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD responded to questions raised during the general debate.
