Election of the Vice-Chair-cum-Rapporteur

Mr. Joannes Ekaprasetya of Indonesia was elected as Vice-Chair-cum-Rapporteur of Sessional Committee II.

Item 5 Economic development in Africa: Trade liberalization and export performance in Africa

Ms. Lakshmi Puri, Acting Deputy Secretary General of UNCTAD, made an opening statement.

Mr. Habib Ouane, Director of the Division for Africa, Least Developed Countries and Special Programmes, made an introductory statement on agenda item 5.

The general debate was opened. Representatives of the following member States made general statements: Zimbabwe (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China); Chad (on behalf of the African Group); Indonesia (on behalf of the Asian Group); Mexico (on behalf of the Group of Latin American and Caribbean States); France (on behalf of the European Union); Bangladesh (on behalf of the least developed countries); China; Cuba; Benin; Japan; and South Africa.

In the interactive debate that followed, representatives of the following member States took the floor: Chad; Mali; Cameroon; and Angola. The representative of the European Commission also took the floor. The secretariat made general observations and responded to questions and comments.

The Board held an informal panel discussion on "Export performance following trade liberation: some patterns and policy perspectives", with the participation of the following panellists: Mr. Arne Lennart Bigsten, University of Gothenburg, Sweden; Mr. Yves Charpentier, Advisor to the Director General, Agence Française de Développement, Paris; and H.E. Mr. Arsene Balihuta, Ambassador of Uganda.

In the interactive debate that followed, representatives of the following member States took the floor: Zimbabwe (on behalf of the Group of 77); Senegal; Lesotho; Chad (on behalf of the African Group); France (on behalf of the European Union); Côte d'Ivoire; Angola; Mali; Israel; and the Russian Federation. The representative of the European Commission also took the floor.

The panellists responded to questions and comments. The Chair made concluding remarks.
