# General debate (cont'd)

The Board continued the general debate. Statements were made by the following member States: Côte d'Ivoire, Japan, Iraq, China, Thailand, the United States of America, South Africa, the United Kingdom, Kenya and Indonesia. The statements of the delegations of Egypt and India were posted on the UNCTAD website.

The representative of the Arab NGO Network for Development made a statement.

The Board thus concluded the general debate.

The Board started consideration of agenda item 4 (Interdependence: Trade and development policy challenges for a sustained recovery of the global economy) and agenda item 8 (Development strategies in a globalized world: Policymaking in an evolving framework of global governance).

Mr. Mukhisa Kituyi, Secretary-General of UNCTAD, made an introductory statement on agenda items 4 and 8. This was followed by remarks by Mr. Richard Kozul-Wright, Director of the Division on Globalization and Development Strategies.
