3. In order to accommodate the suggestions made by delegations, meetings of the session of the Trade and Development Board have been organized in such a way as to ensure that no two meetings will take place simultaneously. They have been designed with a view to ensuring effective participation by delegations, particularly small delegations, and also to making the most efficient use of the conference resources of the United Nations. A detailed programme will be made available in due course.

Evaluation and review of UNCTAD implementation of the quadrennial conference outcome

4. In accordance with paragraph 15 of the Nairobi Maafikiano, the Secretary-General of UNCTAD will present a report on UNCTAD implementation of the quadrennial outcome. The report will be the basis for member States' discussions, which may result in recommendations regarding implementation of the outcome document.

Item 3**Interdependence and development strategies in a globalized world**

5. Deliberations by the Trade and Development Board under the agenda item will provide an opportunity to consider the *Trade and Development Report, 2018: Power, Platforms and the Free Trade Delusion*.

6. The report will examine different aspects of the nature and role of international trade in the era of hyperglobalization and consider related policy challenges that will need to be addressed if trade is to contribute to a more stable and inclusive global economic order.

Item 4**Economic development in Africa**

7. Under the item, the Trade and Development Board will consider a report on UNCTAD activities in support of Africa, which is prepared every year and presented to a session of the Board. The report provides an overview of research and analysis being undertaken by UNCTAD with regard to African development, as well as a summary of specific activities, including advisory services and technical cooperation, in each sector that falls under the mandate of UNCTAD.

Item 5**Investment for development**

8. There is a global trend towards stronger involvement of Governments in pursuing their development goals. Industrial policies are a core instrument of development strategies, and investment policies are a key element of industrial policies. Against the background of a new industrial revolution and the move towards a digital economy, it is critical to review existing and new industrial development strategies and to analyse their interaction with investment policymaking in this new era of globalization.

9. The discussions will be informed by the latest UNCTAD research and policy analysis, which examine the challenges that countries at different development levels face in adapting their investment policies to the new industrial revolution and present policy options to make both industrial policies and investment policies work for sustainable development. The discussions will be an opportunity to hear different perspectives from eminent panellists, which will lead to an interactive dialogue among participants and panellists, bringing in national, regional and interregional perspectives.

10. In addition, the meeting will provide an opportunity for a briefing by the secretariat on the latest developments regarding global trends in and policies on foreign direct investment.

Report on UNCTAD assistance to the Palestinian people

11. As in previous years, the UNCTAD report on assistance to the Palestinian people analyses key issues and recent economic developments in the Occupied Palestinian Territory. The report highlights the rise in Palestinian unemployment, decline in per capita income, dependence on the Israeli economy and expansion of the Israeli settlements in the Occupied Palestinian Territory and elaborates on the de-development of the Gaza Strip.

12. The report updates the Trade and Development Board on proposed and recent UNCTAD technical cooperation activities in the Occupied Palestinian Territory and the challenges the secretariat faces in implementing those activities.
