MESSAGE RECEIVED FROM H.E. MR. LI PENG, PREMIER OF THE STATE COUNCIL OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

On the occasion of the convocation of the ninth session of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development in Midrand, South Africa, I wish to extend, on behalf of the Chinese Government and people, our warm congratulations to the Conference.

The world economy at present is developing along the direction of globalization and liberalization, with growing interdependence between nations. However, the inequitable international economic order continues to seriously constrain the economic development of developing countries, leading to a widening gap between the North and the South.
