UNCTAD'S TECHNICAL COOPERATION PLAN FOR 1999-2001

Note by the UNCTAD secretariat

- 1. UNCTAD IX, in paragraph 96 of "A Partnership for Growth and Development" (TD/378/Rev.1), invited the Board to consider annually "an indicative, rolling three-year plan for technical cooperation".
- 2. The rolling-three year technical cooperation plan for 1998-2000 (TD/B/EX(16)/2) was considered and approved by the Trade and Development Board at its sixteenth executive session on 16 February 1998.
- 3. The Working Party, at the first part of its thirty-second session, held from 21 to 28 September 1998, conducted a programme-by-programme review of UNCTAD's technical cooperation activities undertaken in 1997 (TD/B/45/6 and Add.1 and 2). The Working Party submitted to the Trade and Development Board a draft decision, adopted by the Board at its forty-fifth session, in October 1998 (decision 455(XLV)), which requested the secretariat to "prepare the rolling three-year technical cooperation plan in a simplified format for 1999-2001 for consideration by the Working Party at the second part of its thirty-second session in December 1998 and thereafter by the Trade and Development Board in 1999".
- 4. In response to this request the plan, based on the project listing in document TD/B/45/6/Add.1, was submitted as document TD/B/WP/112. A simplified amount of substantive and financial information was provided. The plan was presented to the Working Party at its resumed thirty-second session on 10 December 1998.

- 5. The Working Party, at its thirty-third session, held from 25 to 29 January 1999, requested the secretariat to revise the plan, taking into account comments by delegations, and to transmit it to the twentieth executive session of the Trade and Development Board, on 5 February 1999. Following this request the present document provides information on the sources of funds of approved projects. Completed projects have been deleted and summary tables added.
- 6. UNCTAD's Technical Cooperation Plan for 1998-2001 has two parts: part I contains a summary table, while part II contains the working sheets on which those tables are based.
- 7. The plan is intended to implement the Technical Cooperation Strategy of UNCTAD adopted by the Board at its fifteenth executive session in June 1997. It is also intended to:
- (a) Inform delegations, cooperating organizations and other interested parties of the operational activities UNCTAD has undertaken in 1998 and those which have been approved for 1999 and subsequent years, as well as those which the secretariat is proposing for the period 1999-2001;
- (b) Facilitate discussions with potential donors on the mobilization of the necessary extrabudgetary resources to implement the plan; and
 - © Serve as the secretariat's monitoring tool.
- 8. The information contained herein is broken down as follows:
 - (a) Actual expenditures incurred in 1998, as at 31 October 1998;
- (b) Approved/ongoing activities for which projects are being implemented in accordance with project documents agreed with donors;
- © Pipeline projects (identified in **bold**) which are at an advanced stage of discussions with donors and have therefore a good chance of being approved;
- (d) New or proposed activities, which also appear in **bold** in the tables. Inclusion of such proposals in the plan is based on one or more of the following considerations:
 - (I) An explicit request from a developing country or country in transition, accepted by the secretariat subject to the mobilization of the necessary funds; or
 - (ii) Implementation of action requested by UNCTAD IX, the Board or a Commission; or

- (iii) Implementation of the work programme set out in the programme narrative for the UNCTAD programme budget for 1999-2000; or
- (iv) An attempt to establish priorities among the various suggested technical cooperation activities; only those projects which, for the variety of reasons given above, are considered a real priority have been included in this version of the plan.
- 9. Since part of the plan is contingent on the mobilization of additional resources, it follows that by no means all of the proposals will in fact be carried out. In addition, new requests will be received and existing proposals may be modified, thereby necessitating constant modifications and adaptations to the plan.
- 10. The plan has been prepared at the same time as the programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001, and there is broad consistency between the two exercises.
- 11. Explanations of the country codes used for project numbering, as well as the abbreviations used in table 4, are to be found in the annex.

Note The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) project RAB/96/001, "Support to Arab States in their pursuit of economic and social reform and multilateral economic cooperation", is executed by the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS). It finances both regional and national activities. All such activities are identified according to the relevant sub-programme but financial data is not apportioned by UNDP on an activity-basis.
